1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Emmett Till and
5	Mamie Till-Mobley and Roberts Temple National Historic
6	Site Act".

7 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

In this Act:

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(1) NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE.—The term "Na-
tional Historic Site" means the Emmett Till and
Mamie Till-Mobley and Roberts Temple National
Historic Site established by section 3(a).
(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
rector of the National Park Service.
SEC. 3. EMMETT TILL AND MAMIE TILL-MOBLEY AND ROB
ERTS TEMPLE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE.
(a) Establishment.—There is established the Em-
mett Till and Mamie Till-Mobley and Roberts Temple Na-
tional Historic Site in the State of Illinois as a unit of
the National Park System.
(b) Purpose.—The purpose of the National Historic
Site is to preserve, protect, and interpret for the benefit
of present and future generations resources associated
with—
(1) the Great Migration;
(2) the memorial service and funeral of Emmet
Till;
(3) the courage and activism of Mamie Till-
Mobley; and
(4) the civil rights movement.
(c) Map; Boundaries.—

1	(1) MAP.—As soon as practicable after the date
2	of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall prepare
3	a map of the National Historic Site.
4	(2) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map prepared
5	under paragraph (1) shall be on file and available
6	for public inspection in the appropriate offices of the
7	National Park Service.
8	(3) Boundaries.—The boundaries of the Na-
9	tional Historic Site shall be the boundaries generally
10	depicted on the map prepared under paragraph (1).
11	(d) Acquisition Authority.—The Secretary may
12	acquire any land or interest in land located within the
13	boundary of the National Historic Site by—
14	(1) donation;
15	(2) purchase from a willing seller with donated
16	or appropriated funds; or
17	(3) exchange.
18	(e) Administration.—
19	(1) In general.—The Secretary shall admin-
20	ister the National Historic Site in accordance with—
21	(A) this Act; and
22	(P) the laws generally applicable to units
	(B) the laws generally applicable to units
23	of the National Park System.

1	(A) DEADLINE FOR COMPLETION.—Not
2	later than 3 years after the date on which funds
3	are first made available to the Secretary for the
4	preparation of a general management plan for
5	the National Historic Site, the Secretary shall
6	prepare a general management plan for the Na-
7	tional Historic Site in accordance with section
8	100502 of title 54, United States Code.
9	(B) Inclusion.—The general manage-
10	ment plan prepared under subparagraph (A)
11	shall identify, as appropriate, the roles and re-
12	sponsibilities of the National Park Service and
13	any applicable management entity in admin-
14	istering and interpreting the National Historic
15	Site and areas affiliated with the National His-
16	toric Site in a manner that does not interfere
17	with existing operations and the continued use
18	of existing facilities at the National Historic
19	Site.
20	(C) Submission to congress.—On com-
21	pletion of the general management plan under
22	subparagraph (A), the Secretary shall submit to
23	the Committee on Energy and Natural Re-
24	sources of the Senate and the Committee on
25	Natural Resources of the House of Representa-

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1 tives the general management plan prepared

2 under that subparagraph.
