



Federal Grant Funding Opportunities Now Available!

Grant and Per Diem (GPD) Program (VA) – deadline February 18, 2026

This grant program funds community organizations to provide transitional housing and supportive services for homeless Veterans, helping them move toward stable, permanent housing.

University Transportation Centers Program (DOT) - deadline February 20, 2026

This program funds university-based transportation research and education centers that advance transportation expertise, technology, and workforce development. Eligible applicants are U.S. institutions of higher education (typically nonprofit) working in consortia to conduct research, education, technology transfer, and training that address key transportation challenges and statutory research priorities such as mobility, safety, infrastructure durability, environment, system preservation, and cybersecurity.

National Infrastructure Investments (DOT) – deadline February 24, 2026

A U.S. Department of Transportation discretionary grant program that funds surface transportation projects with significant local or regional impact — such as roads, bridges, transit, multimodal improvements, and related infrastructure that supports economic development and community goals.

Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD, DOT) – deadline: February 24, 2026

A competitive U.S. Department of Transportation program that funds transformative surface transportation projects—including roads, bridges, transit, ports, rail, and multimodal hubs. It prioritizes projects that improve safety, equity, sustainability, and economic competitiveness, especially those with strong regional or national impact and benefits for underserved or rural communities.

YouthBuild 2025 (DOL) - deadline March 2, 2026

This program is a competitive funding opportunity from the U.S. Department of Labor that will award about \$98 million in grants to eligible organizations to operate YouthBuild programs. These grants support pre-apprenticeship training, education, job placement, and supportive services for disadvantaged young people ages 16-24 who are not in school or employed, helping them earn diplomas or credentials and prepare for careers in construction and other in-demand industries.

NEA Grants for Arts Projects 1, FY 2027 (NEA) - deadline 2/12/2026

This is a grant program that provides project-based funding to U.S. nonprofit organizations, government units, and tribal entities to support a broad range of arts activities—including arts education, dance, music, theater, visual and media arts, literary arts, and more. Awards typically range from about \$10,000 to \$100,000 (with higher amounts for certain sub granting projects) and require a 1:1 cost match. These grants help organizations engage communities with the arts, strengthen cultural capacity, and enhance public access to artistic experiences nationwide.

Environmental Education Grant Program (EPA) – deadline March 2, 2026

The Environmental Education Grant Program supports locally and regionally focused environmental education projects that promote environmental stewardship and help develop knowledgeable and responsible students, teachers, and community members. This grant program provides financial support for projects that design, demonstrate, and/or disseminate environmental education practices, methods, or techniques that increase public awareness and knowledge about local environmental issues and provides participants in its programs the skills necessary to make informed decisions and to take responsible actions toward the environment.
